Transport for Buckinghamshire Road Safety Team want your views

Transport for Buckinghamshire's Road Safety Team would like your feedback on how they currently deliver road safety initiatives across Buckinghamshire.

Questions are being asked about road safety education, training and publicity, such as young driver and motorcyclist training courses, work related road safety, as well as campaigns about drink driving, wearing your seatbelt, eyesight and speed.

The information from this survey will help develop road safety programs throughout Buckinghamshire to reduce the number of collisions on the counties roads and their severity, with the pain and suffering that accompanies many of these crashes.

They are looking to monitor attitudes to a variety of road safety issues and asking for suggestions of future campaigns and initiatives, plus new areas of intervention with a view to improving road safety.

The survey will run until the middle of March after which a report on the results is expected to be available in April.

Valerie Letheren, Buckinghamshire County Council Cabinet Member for Transportation said; "I would encourage the residents of Buckinghamshire to give us their views which will help the Road Safety team to prioritise their work which is particularly directed at vulnerable road users, to reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries on our roads."
