FARMING AND FOOD

Jeremy Clarkson has once again highlighted farming with his very honest almost brutal accounts of his experiences. His programmes are very widely viewed and available on Amazon Prime.

Talking recently to a group over a cup of tea I discovered that they were very surprised to hear that we grew the same arable crops and used very similar machinery. This did rather open my eyes to the fact that most people probably don't know what we do at all. So, I decided it was time to explain even if this meant repeating myself in some respects from earlier articles.

We grow three main cereals around the village of Cheddington. Wheat, barley and oats. All of which are drilled or have seed planted in the autumn and the spring. These cereals are sold through a Grain Merchant who sells them to various manufacturers which would include flour mills such as Heygates and Jordans and others like Weetabix for bread and breakfast cereals. Barley is mainly used for malting for the production of beer. A by-product is brewers grains which Jeremy Clarkson used to fatten up his beef cattle. Oats are also used for making porridge and other breakfast cereals. Feeding animals too and now used in oat milk production. Some of these crops will go on ships for export.

Harvest is approaching at a fast rate as it always does at this time of year and the prospect of extra pairs of hands living on the farm, twelve most probably.

Harvest starts in July when the wheat fields are golden and the seed heads heavy and dry. We test for moisture and wait for the crop to be ready. We use combine harvesters which cut and process the grain which is poured from the machine into tractors and trailers travelling along-side. They then transport the grain to the farm where it is cleaned and stored. We have three harvesting teams. Each of these comprises a combine harvester, with probably two or three tractors and trailers in attendance depending on the distance we travel to and from the farm.

The straw is left in rows behind the combine harvester for baling up using another tractor and baler. Chasers collect up the bales and make the straw stacks. All of this has to be transported by tractor and trailer to a storage area. The straw stacks are covered with tarpaulins to keep them dry and good quality. The straw is used for bedding and feed. Much of it is transported to the West Country to stock farms. It is also sent to the Power Station.

On this farm we have several permanent staff who do the drilling/seeding and look after the crops all year round. We also have an agronomist who keeps a regular eye on the progress of the plants and recommends the nutrients they require at various stages through their growth.

I noticed that Jeremy Clarkson had a noticeable amount of weed in some of his crops which could have perhaps been avoided with better husbandry and agronomy. However, every time a machine and operator cover a field it is a huge expense and therefore it is essential that a good quality and profitable crop is produced.

In July and August we have at least twelve extra pairs of hands. They are mainly British or from New Zealand at present. In the past we have had South Africans, Zimbabweans and Australians. They all have farming backgrounds or a love of farming and have been to agricultural universities or colleges. They usually have experience of operating machinery like ours. Or they have the interest and wish to learn and be involved.

Here we have accommodation for them and we supply all their meals. Harvesting is full on in good weather, no time for cooking! Breakfast is provided in their living accommodation in the farmyard. They get a packed lunch and hot meal at night. And plenty of snacks to see them through long hours working. We hire in 'Bunkabins'. Each unit sleeps two with their own ensuite shower room. They also have a large kitchen and dining area in another block.

However, the main meals are provided by a very capable local café and eaten in the farmhouse. I like to see that everyone is keeping well and happy as its such a busy time.

I hope this has given an insight to those of you curious about what we grow in the fields and I hope I haven't bored those of you who have been reading these articles for more years than I care to admit!



Dear Friends,

When we moved to Aylesbury, we left behind signs proclaiming Gateway to the Dales to those celebrating that we now lived in the Home of the Paralympics. When communities or counties opt to label themselves, I suppose there is a great challenge to not only saying something that is significant but does not raise questions about the legitimacy of the description provided. Then I think back to my birth-place in north Manchester. I wonder how you might depict a community has seen better days and in which the grind of city living is all too obvious.

Which all brings me to my point about how you might describe the place in which you live? If someone from beyond asked you in a few words to encapsulate the reality of life in your community, what might you say? The aforementioned Gateway to the Dales is Skipton in North Yorkshire. It is, in a very real way, an accurate statement, if you venture to travel through some spectacular countryside but the word gateway gives an impression of something spectacular. Now the town centre has an undeniable charm; there are some areas that appear respectable and comfortable and, yet, there are still areas of deprivation hidden from the view of those who visit. Beyond appearance there are questions about what it's like to live in a place from other natives friendly to what goes on?

So, if you were to build a picture of your village community what positive attributes might be mentioned? One of the things that impresses me about village life is that there seems to be a higher degree of care for one's neighbours than is often found in towns. I think it is much easier to be invisible if you live in a large community compared to a small one. In villages there appears to be a greater desire to include, a focus that is much harder to attain in a place of many thousands. What is your village like?

Somewhere in the midst of this will be the parish church and the Methodist chapel, which in some places can be depicted as the beating heart of the community. This is not

because of their size, or influence, or the numbers that attend but because they are places pounded on love, seeking to share hope and with a desire to allow something of the transformative nature of the Christian gospel to reach out and touch their communities. They offer a visible encouragement to think beyond ourselves, to grapple with the big questions and to listen out for rumours of the love that can change both individual and community life. They are not heroic of some bygone age but a visible offer of God's grace in the midst of our troubled world inviting us to see the hope that faith brings contrasted with the questions that our politicians raise. Love is at the centre of your community because the people of God in your minds are longing that love will come and refresh all our lives.



FROM THE RECTOR.

Fear and Chaos

"In the beginning God made heaven and earth. And the earth was invisible and unformed; and darkness was upon the abyss, and the Spirit of God was rushing upon the water"

Genesis 1:1-2

The opening verses of the bible start with darkness and a watery abyss. Some translations use the word chaos. This image is meant to be slightly unsettling. In some ancient cultures expanses of water represented the frightening forces beyond our control. Later in the gospels, even seasoned fishermen were unnerved when Jesus fell asleep during a storm in a boat on the Sea of Galilee. In the ancient mind, all manner of demons and uncontrollable evil was believed to lurk in the waters, which I also think was a metaphor for wider fears in society. Fear of chaos has been a powerful motivator over the centuries for people in power, with myths and propaganda used to stoke those fears. After the end of the book of Genesis, the Egyptian fear of Hebrew immigrants was used as a justification for Hebrew enslavement and their mass murder.

The book of Genesis probably reached the final written form we know today during time of the Babylonian empire around 600 BCE. The Jewish people defeated and exiled, might have started to believe the propaganda that Babylonian dominance was for their greater good and that the other defeated nations had been part of the chaos which needed to be brutally suppressed. When those who are oppressed start to believe that they deserve that treatment this is called internalised oppression. But the opening vers-

es of Genesis reminded them that at the very beginning, the symbolic chaos of the watery abyss, far from being the sum of their worst fears, was the place where the Spirit of God was moving, even rushing, in the work of creation.

Today we too are encouraged to worry about chaos and threats that might be about to overwhelm us. Whether these are the threats of small boats, cyclists on the road, or gender identity issues, we are at risk of being manipulated by powerful voices stoking up fears. Fears as simple as these can be used to justify a lack of basic human kindness, or even the loss of our own human rights. Jesus told his disciples that perfect love casts out fear.

So let's be like the Hebrew exiles. Let's remember our foundation stories in the Bible. Let's remember the saviour Jesus whose willing death on the cross, the ultimate Roman sanction against the forces of chaos, can set us free from the ultimate fear of death. Instead of allowing ourselves to be divided by our fears, let's be encouraged that at the beginning of creation, the watery chaos was the very place where the Holy Spirit was involved in an act of creation, so incredible that it is beyond our understanding!
