## **BUCKS COUNCILLORS NEWS.**

**General.** This will be my last report as a Buckinghamshire Councillor: I will not be standing for re-election on the 1<sup>st</sup> May. There will be 10 candidates standing for election to represent the Ivinghoe Ward and each registered voter can vote for 2 candidates, please remember you have 2 votes. Whatever your preferences, I do encourage everyone to use your vote even if you do a spoil, it will be recorded. A no vote is a lost vote.

I have had 10 years as your council representative, firstly with AVDC – Aylesbury Vale District Council and latterly with BC – Buckinghamshire Council. During that time I have been impressed by the number of people across the ward and Parishes who are committed to supporting and serving the community for zero remuneration and they are still there. I thank them all for their friendly interaction and help which included the very difficult and strange period with COVID, remember that? We had Parish Council meetings in the car park at the village hall. It became cold as darkness came.

**Litter.** Some villagers will be aware that the Cheddington Residents Association (CRA) conduct a litter pick twice per year. This is a real credit to the village and the environment looks much better for it – Thanks CRA.

Additionally, the proprietor of the Airfield operation also conducts a litter pick aimed at the usual fly tipping sites along the Long Marston Road; we all know these sites. The material is unlikely to be from the Airfield site considering that 2 of the businesses deal in waste and it would easier to dump on site. This is contrary to a couple of anonymous letters accusing the airfield operator of littering along the Long Marston Road and fly tipping. Mr anonymous you're wrong.

Fly tipping is a widespread problem and costs the public purse an absolute fortune equivalent to a number of hospitals NOT being built each year, so if you do witness anything and it is safe to do so take photos and report, please. The worst area in the ward has been around Slapton where the enforcement team have been involved with results that hopefully will reduce the incidents.

**Traffic on Long Marston Road.** There have been several accidents around the entrance to the Airfield re-

cently. The operator has been very active reporting this to all neighbouring parish councils and Bucks Council (BC), and the police have been involved. They have also approached BC to consider additional signage or allowing the Airfield to install road side indicators/information warning traffic of the approach to the access/entrance. Another possible proposal can be a speed limit. The process to allow signage is protracted and low priority so the airfield operator has approached the PC for support to progress the requirements.

Once the elections take place in May, a new Chair and Vice-Chair, who will be a Buckinghamshire Councillor, will be assigned from one of the wards in the East Bucks Community Board area.

Once they are in their positions, the next stage will be setting our priorities for 2025/2026 and the board would like your involvement in setting these for the local area you live, work and play. 



# FARMING AND FOOD

## From the Farming Press.

**Tariffs** – The news is all about tariffs and how it will affect our businesses in the UK.

The United States is our second largest export market beyond the EU and while the main exports to the US include machinery, cars and pharmaceuticals, the £2.9 million worth of beef, £23 million of pork and £68 million of cheese exported from the UK to the US each year are figures not to be sniffed at.

UK manufactured cheese and Scotch whisky (£971 mill. 2024) are two products which have seen traditionally high demand from the US market, and it looks like consumers will bear the brunt of higher prices to cope with the tariffs as the US enters an era of protectionism. Future deals must not come at the expense of our high standards and food welfare. No-one wants to see hormone treated beef or chlorinated chicken on our supermarket shelves.

**Aldi** – Has met its commitment of increasing spending with British suppliers by the end of 2025, a year earlier than planned. In 2020 Aldi pledged to spend an additional £3.5 billion a year with British suppliers by the end of 2025. However, Britain's fourth-largest supermarket has already surpassed this target, spending more than £14bn with UK businesses in 2024.

Aldi says "British suppliers have always been at the heart of our business. From home grown apples to home grown beef and from crisps to cocktails – our range is full of British products sourced from suppliers right here in the UK.

By working closely with British businesses, we continue to champion local suppliers and support the UK economy."

Last year Aldi signed a 20-year agreement with family-owned fruit farm A.C.Goatham in Kent to create 81-hectare Aldi Orchard to supply the entire core range of British apples.

**Waitrose** – will become the first UK grocer to surpass the Better Chicken Commitment – all fresh chicken to meet the commitment. Waitrose is launching a transparent welfare labelling scheme which rates chicken products.

**JCB** – are planning to double capacity at its new £389m factory in San Antonio, Texas which is due to open for production next year. JCB chief executive said this would mitigate the impact of tariffs in the medium term.

**Case New Holland** – has reportedly paused shipments between Europe and North America while it assesses the impact of tariffs. Many smaller UK agricultural equipment manufacturers also expect export sales to be hit.

**Arla Foods** – Denmark based Arla works with more than 7,600 farmers across the UK and EU. This dairy cooperative plan to merge with the DMK Group and will become the largest in Europe. The company will continue to be based in Denmark and bear the Arla name.

**Trump tariffs** – It's possible farm businesses could benefit from lower red diesel prices in the short term as a result of disruption to global markets. However, fertiliser costs remain firm. Everyone is going to be happy if the predicted falls in diesel and petrol prices fall further (RAC).

**Jeremy Clarkson** – will host the farmers annual Cereal Event at Diddly Squat in 2026! His latest series will be released on Prime Video on May 23<sup>rd</sup> 2025. For those of you who haven't yet seen this entertaining and illuminating treat

– it's not to be missed!

**Locally** – Let's not forget local rural events in May – support Leighton Buzzard Young Farmers – Bedfordshire YFC Show & Rally on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> May at Manor Farm, Pertenhall LU5 6LA. A smashing day out for all the family.

## St. GILES PARISH CHURCH.



The journey home

*In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places... And you know the way to the place where I am going.'* <sup>5</sup> Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' <sup>6</sup> Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.'

(John 14: 2a, 4-6)

In March I received an astonishing email from a Methodist lay preacher in Swanbourne called Ken. But let me give you some background first. My journey to be here with you has been an interesting one. This time last year I had never heard of any of the eight villages where I am now the Team Rector or where I live in Wing. In July I responded to an

advert in the Church Times seeking a Team Rector for this group of churches and we arrived in September. We knew nothing about this region of the country and I remember scouring my address book to see if we might know anyone down here. Although I originally come from Bristol, my wife and I had lived in the West Midlands for the previous thirty years after we met at the University of Birmingham. She is from East Yorkshire so Birmingham was halfway between our two families. We're still finding our feet but this is starting to feel like home for us now after six months of living with you.

When I opened the email from Ken on 3<sup>rd</sup> March I read a long list of names. In the year 1798 a shepherd called William Wells married a woman called Eleanor Harris at All Saints Church in Wing. The new family moved to Ivinghoe where their eldest son Henry is on the baptism records there. Henry had a son called George who became a successful builder and married a woman called Elizabeth. They had a daughter called Maria who married a carpenter called Jesse. They had a daughter called Elsie, who had a daughter called Erica. Erica had a son called Dominic!

I didn't know where I was going when I came here. But I feel that Christ has led me to a dwelling place here. It turns out that the village where I live and one of the churches where I am now Team Rector is where my great (x5) grandmother and my great (x5) grandfather lived and got married. I found out that Ken is my mother's second cousin.

We feel at home in the places where we experience love, particularly of friends and family. My home is here amongst you for a while but I believe there is a place for all of us that will be more like home than anywhere we've known. It will be our eternal home with our heavenly Father. We can put our faith in his son Jesus 'the way the truth and the life' to lead us there.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

**The Day of Pentecost.** I will be on sabbatical from June to August, so I thought of reflecting on one of my favourite liturgical seasons, the day of Pentecost where the last day of Easter is like the last piece put into the jigsaw. The coming of the promised Holy Spirit upon the Christian community signifies the completion of the paschal mystery. Christ has died, has been raised and has ascended and now the Father has sent the Spirit.

Luke gives a pictorial view of the coming of the Holy Spirit: *When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Act 2:1-14)*

The remarkable thing about this phenomenon is that people from all over the world heard them and understood them, Peter spoke powerfully and many came to faith. Though the Acts story is the principal story about the coming of the Holy Spirit each year, John 20:19-23 advocates that the Holy Spirit was already at work some weeks before Pentecost.

Therefore, it is noteworthy that we exercise care when we speak of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. This was the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Christian community, but it was not the first experience of the Holy Spirit as if there had been no Holy Spirit before. Genesis speaks of the Spirit hovering over the waters when the world was created (Genesis 1.2). The Holy Spirit overshadowed Mary at the annunciation (Luke 1:35) and inspired Elizabeth when Mary visited her (Luke 1:41). God's Spirit is at work in the world; however, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the faith community and for this reason it is known as 'the birthday of the Church'. I yearn for a fresh outpouring of the Spirit on the Church and on the world.

So may the Spirit of God, who hovered over the waters when the world was created, breathe into us the life it gives.

May the Spirit, who overshadowed the Virgin Mary when God the Son came among us, make us joyful in the service of the Lord.

May the Spirit, who set the Church on fire on the day of Pentecost, set me on fire for my sabbatical and bring the world alive with the love of the risen Christ. Amen.


