### **Matters Arising**

- Website The Vision Statement and notes of meetings are on the website. After looking through questionnaires the Village Assets need to be agreed prior to putting on the website.
- Grant Monitoring Form Peter to talk to the PC Clerk next week at the Parish Assembly.
- > Action Plan Jean Fox has referred this to Neil Homer. No answer received.

### **Questionnaires**

- The majority of information from the Questionnaires was collated in time for the 2<sup>nd</sup> March event.
- Several completed questionnaires have since been submitted. These will be added to the data collated.
- It is important that the questionnaires are kept for future reference if needed. Chris took the questionnaires to store.

## Public Event – "Have Your Say Day" – Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> March

- Posters, The Vision Statement, photographs, plans of the village showing sites that could possibly be developed, recreational suggestions and questionnaire results were on display at the event.
- > Over 100 people attended the event.
- Visitors were invited to put messages on "Post Its" with regard to sites and facilities they would like to see. These have been typed up and will be available soon.
- The views expressed at the event varied but some of the topics that came up frequently were the School capacity, GP facilities, Youth facilities, elderly housing and housing for first time buyers. Everyone seemed to agree that mixed development was needed rather than just one type to keep the village as a village with something for all age groups. A lot of people liked the idea of having more recreational facilities (for youngsters / teenagers) and improving the Pavilion at the recreation ground. Possibly with a café / tea room included. When suggested the

idea of a Community Orchard along the railway line (from the orchard plots at the allotments all the way to the top of the recreation ground) was well received.

- Consultation with residents is ongoing, probably until May and the SG would welcome more views from residents.
- It was agreed to approach village organisations to ask if they would like someone from the NP steering group to visit or if they have any concerns. If appropriate a display could also be provided at the village Fete in July,
- The Chairman thanked the SG for a successful event which in addition to being very informative was also enjoyed and appreciated by those attending.

### <u>Site Visits</u>

- Andrew and Christine walked round the village to look at the following sites; The Orchards (five areas), Croft Meadow, Hillside / Leeches Way, West End Road, Barkham Close, Partridge Close, TT Field, Land between Falcon House and the old allotments, The Baulk, Station Road, Mentmore Road, Blenhiem area.
- These have not been assessed yet as it is considered advisable to have help from Nigel Homer / Jean Fox with this.
- From the questionnaires and comments left at the Have Your Say Day it would seem that residents would like development to be mixed, in small areas and spread over several years so that the effects on infrastructure can be monitored.

### **Correspondence**

E-mail from Berrys, Chartered Surveyors & Valuers regarding the 12 acre field that backs on to Gooseacre, Leeches Way and Manor Pound Road to request that this area or part of it be considered for residential development. (This is one of the areas for assessment). Christine has acknowledged receipt.
