CRA NEWS.

Orchard Manor development Charles Church has now released houses for sale. It is by appointment only and currently Jayne, their sales advisor, is working from their Buzzard Meadows site in Leighton Buzzard. She can be contacted on 01296 796429.

They have released a mixture of 3,4 and 5 bedroom homes starting at £489,995. They are aiming to be on site at the beginning of November and anticipate launching their show home in December.

Bulb Planting. During the last fortnight CRA has planted almost 700 daffodil bulbs near the Blenheim roundabouts. So we hope that the daffodil display in the Spring will be even more colourful than before.

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' NEWS

Additional parking for town centre and theatre visitors. Changes to the management of the Waterside multi-storey car park, above Waitrose, from Wednesday 9 October, will provide 101 additional parking spaces (96 standard and 5 disabled bays) for town centre and theatre visitors. Floor 1 will remain reserved for Waitrose customers, but both Floors 2 and 3 will be managed by Aylesbury Vale District Council (AVDC) and will be available for general public use.

From Wednesday 9 October anyone parking on Floor 2 or 3 will have to 'pay & display' either using the ticket machines in the car park or pay-by-phone by calling 0330 400 7275 or registering for the service by going to www.paybyphone.co.uk. The current scale of charges is displayed on ticket machines and on notices in the car park. Floor 1 of the car park will be controlled and operated by Waitrose with a maximum stay of 90 minutes.

Please see signage on Floor 1 for full terms and conditions or speak to a Partner at the welcome desk.

Councillor Julie Ward, AVDC Cabinet Member for Civic Amenities, said: "changing level 2 of the car park to general public use will provide an additional 101 spaces. It has also enabled us to remove the time restriction of 2 hours. "The change is particularly welcomed as we move towards Christmas with the winter markets and other seasonal retail offers in the town centre and the busy pantomime season starting in early December at Waterside Theatre. "It also responds to the call for extra parking given the success of new restaurants and bars in the area including Rococo Lounge, The Grill Steakhouse and Zizzi in The Exchange and Miya, in the former police station".

Vale residents urged to renew their voter registration. Electoral Canvas staff will be out and about over the next few weeks, visiting properties that have yet to respond to the Electoral Canvass. All properties in Aylesbury Vale received a 'Household Enquiry Form' during the summer and a reminder in September, but around 9,500 responses remain outstanding.

Residents are required by law to confirm or update the details of anyone at their address who is eligible to vote in the UK. The forms are pre-printed with the names of the occupants currently registered to vote at each address. A response is required, either to update their details if there are any changes, or to confirm that the information is still the same. People who have moved address recently are particularly encouraged to respond. Across Great Britain, only 40% of people who have lived at an address for less than one year will be registered, compared to 94% of people who have been at their property for more than sixteen years.

Jo Hart, AVDC Electoral Services Manager, commented: "Although the Electoral Canvass response rate to date has been encouraging, nearly 12% of homes in the Vale have yet to respond. We have to take a number of prescribed steps to follow up on non responding properties, and those households that have not responded have to be personally visited. This is an expensive exercise, and we're therefore urging residents to help us save money by responding ASAP."

Residents can respond quickly and easily online using a unique two-part security code which is printed on the form. The online process also allows people to add the names of any new occupants as well as remove names of those who no longer live at the address, or request a postal application. AVDC and TVP mount successful joint operation to ensure licensing compliance. As a result of a joint operation by Aylesbury Vale District Council (AVDC) Taxi Licensing team and Thames Valley police officers, two private hire vehicles were suspended for vehicle defects, drivers were also issued penalty points against their private hire drivers' licences and other drivers were issued Fixed Penalty Notices by Thames Valley Police Officers.

Last Saturday (14 September 2019) officers from the Aylesbury Vale District Council Taxi Licensing team, carried out a joint enforcement operation in Aylesbury town centre with Thames Valley Police Officers to check over private hire and hackney carriage vehicles to ensure they

were complying with the conditions of their licences. On the evening two private hire vehicles were suspended for vehicle defects such as non operational headlights, chipped/cracked windscreens and protruding sharp edges. Drivers were also issued penalty points against their private hire drivers' licences for not wearing their driver badges, no first aid kits, wrong size fire extinguishers and broken lamp casings. Other drivers were issued Fixed Penalty Notices by Thames Valley Police Officers for not wearing their seatbelt, having defective headlights and another for failing to obey road traffic signs, contravening road traffic regulations. Another driver was identified by Thames Valley Police officers as failing to notify the council of a recent arrest and will now face an investigation by Licensing Officers to determine his fitness to continue to hold a private hire drivers licence.

The Taxi Licensing team have introduced a dedicated team to complete Enhanced Vehicle Checks on all licensed vehicles to ensure that all vehicles comply with the Taxi and Private Hire Licensing Policy and standards set by the Council to ensure compliance and passenger safety.

Licensing Officer Michelle Shelly said: "We appreciate that a bulb can go at any time in any vehicle, so we encourage drivers to carry bulbs with them in their licensed vehicles so these can be changed at the side of the road to prevent the suspension of their vehicle or incurring a penalty by the police. Aylesbury Vale is a mostly rural district and driving with a defective headlight is very dangerous.

"Most of the types of defects identified on the night are preventable by drivers carrying out regular checks on their vehicles prior to commencing work. Private Hire and Hackney Carriage vehicles provide a much needed service to the public and it is the drivers and operators responsibility to ensure that their vehicles are regularly serviced and well maintained." Cllr Sue Renshell. Chairman of AVDC's Licensing Committee said: "The council will continue to carry out these joint enforcement operations to ensure all licensed vehicles are up to standard and safe for the travelling public. This enforcement action is a great example of successful joint agency working and highlights the need for regular enforcement operations. "The Taxi Licensing team and I would like to thank the Police Officers from #Team4 for their dedicated proactive approach on the night."

East - West Expressway and HS2 updates.

At the recent AVDC council meeting a unanimous vote was recorded to oppose the proposed East – West Expressway that is intended to link the M1 to the M40 and Oxford across north Buckinghamshire – Vale of Aylesbury. A similar outcome was also recorded by BCC a week later. Additionally, both AVDC and BCC refused to sign a NDA (Non-Disclosure Agreement) with the agent/contractor.

The new PM has indicated a review of the HS2 project is to be conducted to consider the business case and expenditure. This was welcomed by AVDC.

Environmental and Climate Emergency. As referenced above the same council meeting debated its position with respect to the operational 'carbon footprint'. This was after presentations from a 9 year old and a 13

year old Aylesbury school children to the full council – impressive from such young individuals.

A vote was recorded to target the AVDC operations to be carbon free by 2030.



"20 is plenty for Bucks". The Parish Council is often asked about having a 20 MPH speed limit though Cheddington, so we put this to Transport for Bucks at a recent Local Area Forum. We were told categorically that (unlike our neighbouring counties) Buckinghamshire does NOT have 20MPH speed limit zones, and nor does it intend to implement them anytime soon. We asked about the Buckinghamshire village of Askett, which has a 20MPH speed limit. We were told that this was a pilot scheme and their evaluation had shown that it had not been effective in reducing speed. Transport for Bucks went on to say that in another circumstance, "a 20PMH limit was actually responsible for a child being knocked down outside a school". We, along with other parish councils, challenged this assertion and were told that an impatient driver had overtaken someone because they were only driving at 20MH outside a school. We felt this was a case of 'bad driving', which could have happened at any speed! We are not the only village who is concerned about speed and have joined forces with some other parish councils in a "20 is plenty for Bucks" network. Protect yourself and your family - time to get the flu vaccine. As the winter months start to draw in, health and social care services across Buckinghamshire are appealing to the public to ensure that they vaccinate themselves, their children or relatives as soon as they can. Getting vaccinated is a great way to guard against getting poorly from the flu or developing more serious complications and this year the vaccines available will provide even better defence against the virus.

The flu vaccine is offered free on the NHS to:

- All children aged 2-10 years. It's given as a quick, painless nasal spray. If your child goes to school then the vaccine can be given by the school nursing team. If not, then please contact your GP to book an appointment.
- Everyone aged 65 and over. Book an appointment with your GP or pharmacist.

- All pregnant women arrange a vaccine with your GP or midwife
- People aged under 65 with certain health conditions that make the flu more serious like diabetes, heart and lung conditions or the immunosuppressed.

The vaccine for people aged under 65 will protect against four strains of the virus and this year there is an enhanced vaccine for everyone aged 65 and over which offers even more protection because it contains an additional boost designed to help the immune system develop strong defence against the flu virus. This is particularly important for this age group as immunity decreases with age.

Also this year more vaccines are available and every primary school child will be offered a flu vaccine. Children are 'super spreaders' of flu. Flu vaccination not only protects the children but it also protects other more vulnerable members of the community from a potentially horrible illness.

Likewise, women who are pregnant can talk to their GP or midwife about getting the free vaccine as it will help protect both them and their baby.

If you are not eligible for a free flu jab but would still like to have one, many pharmacies will provide the vaccine as a private service for a small fee.

COUNTRYSIDE NEWS

Walking along the footpaths and between the hedges with Oscar this morning I was impressed to hear so much birdsong.

It is drizzling and mild here on the south Devon coast where we are enjoying a post harvest break. The birds seem to like these conditions and it is a thrill to hear and see so many especially the wren. The tiniest but cutest and pluckiest little thing and my favourite British bird. Reading the local 'Village Voice' I see an ornithologist has seen 46 species in the bay including the pied flycatcher, collared dove and skylark. A home recently I was delighted to see kingfishers on the Grand Union Canal in Wilstone.

We all need cheering up! There is so much talk about the decline in birds, insects, flora and wild mammals. Here in Devon the hedges are full of pink Campion and other species of wild flower. The south Devon cattle are lying about in the fields and so are the flocks of sheep. Across the hills we can see rows of various coloured brassicas which I assume are cabbages, cauliflowers and broccoli. Nearby the potato harvest is in full flow and the straw bales are being shifted to dry storage. As a child in Hampshire I took the magic of nature for granted. We used to walk in the forestry commission where water pools dried up in hot summers but reappeared in wet ones! Between the ages of 5 and 8 I used to mess about in these and I'd like to know how it is that these bugs disappear and reappear? Such as water boatmen and water striders? And even newts? We must be mindful of the beautiful and magical environment in which we live and in order to protect it the government has, for years now, encouraged farmers to leave field edges uncultivated to achieve this end. Plantations of trees have been added on our farm and many others....and hedges and beetle banks. Do not underestimate the farming community because we love the natural world and we believe we are custodians of our wonderful countryside.

Being mindful of the environment which is such a hot subject right now I am concerned to see on local Facebook pages how many people are still 'fly tipping'. In fact I can think of several recent rubbish dumps in the immediate vicinity. I wonder if people realize it is possible to investigate and identify the source of these. They can be reported online at Bucks County Council where I have just read there were 482 reports in the last week.

I have also read Facebook posts about dog walking and dog fouling. I cannot understand why it is such a problem to pick up the poo and place it in the receptacles provided. I don't have to worry too much around the farm but

when I am on the public footpaths I always have bags in my pocket. In fact Oscar turns round to have a look and check that I have picked it up before we progress further! There is nothing worse, is there, than stepping on it?! Here is some information I found on the internet....

'Dog owners can be fined between £50-£80 on-the-spot if they fail to clear up after their dog's mess.

In some constituencies, you can be struck with a penalty for forgetting to carry poo bags or pooper scoopers when walking your furry friend.

This price varies from council to council and refusing to pay up can land you in court.

It has been reported that this fine could soon be increased under new town hall rules, with dog walkers facing £1,000 fines if they leave home without poo bags to pick up after their pets.

So you have been warned!

Meanwhile when should your dog be on and off the lead? So from the Blue Cross website.....

Dogs should not be allowed to 'worry' livestock. This means owners must prevent dogs from attacking livestock, chasing livestock, or not being on a lead or under close control in a field containing sheep.

Even if your dog does not bite livestock, chasing or barking at them can cause pregnant animals to abort their young through stress.

When walking in the countryside or other areas where you're likely to come across cattle, sheep, horses and other animals, we recommend keeping your dog on a lead. Be particularly wary of farm animals with their young. If you feel threatened or are chased by livestock, then let go of the lead for your own safety. It's usually the dog they see as a threat rather than you and most dogs can easily outrun a cow.

If you are walking across farmland where you can see livestock, or even if you think sheep, cattle, goats or other animals maybe nearby, it's really important to put your dog on a lead.

In our arable fields I walk our dogs off the lead because they just love to run but I do scan the field for deer and hares before letting them off. They are sociable with other dogs and readily return when called by name.

Finally I was very lucky to have a teatime visit from our Cheddington Rainbow Guides. What a thrill it was to have a chat about where our Weetabix (etc) and bread starts its life! We talked about barley too and I hope some of the Dads heard about where there beer comes from....quote 'my Dad likes beer'. \odot

Government minister Lord Gardiner of Kimble was in Ivinghoe on Friday 11th October to visit the Beacon Villag-

es Community Library (BVCL), as part of Buckinghamshire's Libraries Week.

BVCL, in the medieval Ivinghoe Town Hall, was singled out for the visit as "a great example of how a library can provide a valuable community resource in a rural setting."

Lord Gardiner is a minister in the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. He serves as Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Rural Affairs and Biosecurity.

The Community Library, run by a committee of local people, shares space in the town hall with the village post office.

The Beacon villages library offers traditional book borrowing and many other services. You can use it to get online, to print and photocopy and use your library membership to access a host of digital services such as e-magazines and e-newspapers.

Beacon Villages Library is one of a cluster of community buildings and facilities in Ivinghoe which include a pharmacy, post office, a hairdresser and a playground as well as The Hub, another community-run building, with a coffee shop and shared office space.

Avril Davies, who chairs the committee that runs Beacon Villages Community Library, said: "We were delighted to be chosen to host Lord Gardiner today, and show him how our thriving Community Library works. BVCL is an extremely important asset at the heart of our village offering many services and facilities to people in this part of the county and we've been able to show that today."

Lord Gardiner said: "I am delighted to be here at Beacon Villages Community Library, which is a perfect illustration of how public institutions can bring people together in rural areas.

"Libraries play a key role for vibrant communities across England, inspiring people of all ages, building digital skills, fostering health and wellbeing and supporting local business."

MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER

Dear friends.

I've recently been flicking through some old family photos with my children of my great grandfather who fought in the first world war. He was a Royal Engineer and is sat on a camel alongside some Australian soldiers in front of the sphinx, we are also lucky to have copies of his medals. In todays, High Definition, multi-coloured, internet and technological world looking at black and white photos can seem quite strange. Black and white can make the subjects of the picture seem like they are from some old history book, or from someone else's memory from long ago – perhaps even making you question if it really ever happened.

I have recently watched Peter Jackson's film "They shall not grow old". In the film he has restored and coloured old footage of soldiers in the First World War. Somehow those men have become once again real, not characters in a history book or a family story, but real men. It certainly is moving, wonderful even and yet sobering too. Whilst the colour and the natural movement makes us remember them as real people, we can also get some impression of the horror.

Each November we have been remembering those men and those who have died after them in the many subsequent wars. As time goes by those names that are on our war memorials have perhaps become merely black and white photos and part of our family storybooks — no one living remembers them as the vibrant, real, young people they were — and it is all too easy to forget the actual horror of war and death too. It is important then, every year to bring to mind the reality of real people who sacrificed so much.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, We will remember them.







