The Annual Governance & Accountability Return for the Year 24–25 has been approved by the external auditor, PKF Littlejohn, and is available for viewing on the Cheddington website with a paper copy also available on the notice board at The Green.

**VANDALISM AND THEFT.** Unfortunately, the Parish Council must inform residents that there have been several incidents of vandalism recently. Two of the benches at the old allotments site, opposite the Recreation Ground, have been forcibly pushed out of the concrete and are unrepairable so will be removed. If there are enough funds, when the PC is doing the budget for Yr 25–26, it will try to replace at least one of the benches. The pagoda at the Recreation Ground has been graffitied – an extra job for our handyfolk – but to top it all the portaloo, used by the various sports clubs using the Recreation Ground, was stolen around midday on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September. CCTV footage has been passed on to the police. If you saw this incident happening and have any information, please contact the Clerk.

#### METHODIST CHURCH LISTED

Bucks Council has added the Methodist Church to its Local Heritage List.

Local Heritage List Background. Since 2021 locally important sites and those reflecting local character have been assessed and added to the new countywide Local Heritage List. This is not the same as statutory listings (such as Grade I and II buildings), which are designated by Historic England. As a local authority Bucks Council are working to ensure that Buckinghamshire's historic environment is protected at a local level as well as nationally. You can find out more about the Local List project on: https://local-heritage-list.org.uk/buckinghamshire

What does this mean for the building? Adding a site or building to the Local List should not adversely affect the church. It is one tool used by the local planning authority to identify locally important heritage assets, which can also be identified during the course of a planning application or as part of a Conservation Area Review. This means that, in the event that a planning application is submitted that affects the property, its heritage significance will be a material consideration in the determination of planning applications that affect the fabric, character or setting of the asset. Local listing does not alter existing Permitted Development Rights. Where a building is locally listed, Listed Building Consent (LBC) will not be required for works to the property. Its heritage significance will be a material consideration in the determination of such planning applications.

The benefit of Local Listing to owners is that if/when the church do consider applying for planning permission, their agent will be able to identify that there is recognised heritage value early in the design process and can consider this in their proposed scheme. This can save money revising proposals and helps to avoid the 'shock' that can occur when we identify heritage value during the course of an application.



#### From the Minister

#### I am so grateful.

The Vale of Aylesbury Circuit granted me a sabbatical from June to August 2025, with Richard, the Superintendent, covering my duties in my absence. The concept of the sabbatical is present in the New Testament; for example, Hebrews 4:9–11 references a spiritual rest designated for God's people. They help prevent burnout, support mental health, and encourage personal reflection. It is comparable to a valuable resource or treasure that we should manage judiciously with a grateful heart.

I am grateful for my sabbatical, during which I focused on the role of women in Acts as models for the church and society. My study examined whether Acts portrays men and women as equally qualified for ministry and leadership, and whether any ministries are restricted to women by principle. This period deepened my faith through scripture, reflection, and reading, allowing for meaningful and unhurried time with God–an experience I cherish deeply.

I am deeply appreciative of my family, and the sabbatical provided an invaluable opportunity to strengthen familial bonds. We participated in activities previously unattainable due to other commitments, including shared worship and nightly readings of the Psalms. During our time in Montserrat, we stayed with my sister and her family. We enjoyed the abundance of local fruits each morning and basked in the region's bright sunshine. The island's verdant land-scape provided a restorative environment. Emmanuel drank natural spring water from Runaway Ghaut, which is believed to ensure a return visit to the island. Overall, this sabbatical has greatly enriched my faith and practice, and I remain profoundly grateful to God, the circuit, and my family for their support.

Below is a reflective entry from my journal:

"Eternal Being, we express our gratitude for your consistent guidance. Your timing remains precise, placing us in situations that foster spiritual growth and deepen our reliance on you. We seek fulfilment and direction, aspiring to be receptive to your presence and maintain a spirit of gratitude.

Faithful God, we are also thankful for the Vale of Aylesbury Circuit and recognise the dedication and abilities of its parishioners. We request continued support in fulfilling our responsibilities with integrity and commitment, striving to represent our faith with authenticity. We invite your Spirit to strengthen our resolve further and cultivate gratefulness within us.

Additionally, Lord we acknowledge the value of family as a source of encouragement and connection. We ask for harmony and perseverance among families, hoping they will embody unity, compassion, forgiveness, foresight, longevity, and well-being. May each experience your presence and develop a grateful heart.

Finally, Lord, we reflect on your profound influence in all aspects of life-acknowledging the remarkable nature of your works and our ongoing readiness to engage with you in gratitude." Amen.

#### Monday 20<sup>th</sup> October Talk by Paul Barwick: The Life and Crimes of Double Agent Zigzag.

This is the remarkable story of Eddie Chapman. He hated authority as far back as he could remember. Authority detested him back and from an early age he was always in trouble with the law. On the run from Scotland Yard, he was imprisoned for a burglary in Jersey just before the German forces invaded in June 1940. Rather than spend the whole war in prison he offered the Third Reich his services as a German secret agent. Highly trained in spy-craft and sabotage, he was sent back to Britain on a deadly mission to derail British aircraft manufacturing. However, Eddie had other ideas, turning himself in to MI5 and becoming a double agent for the Allies, working to help defeat the Nazis. The only British service personnel ever to receive an Iron Cross, his true story is an amazing episode in British espionage history. We meet at 8 p.m. at the Methodist Church by the Green in the village High Street. Visitors are welcome.

#### **BUCKS COUNCILLORS' NEWS.**

Local Plan. The latest proposals for the new plan for Buckinghamshire future housing, employment and green space have now gone out to consultation. Figures for what (1958). The Accreditation Assessment is a rigorous proare being proposed are set out below. It should be noted that the total numbers required have increased from the old plan due to the government['s desire to build 1.5 million homes during this parliament. The old plan proposed 65,000 homes with 22,000 having already been either built or started construction and this is for up to the year 2045.

The proposed headline numbers are set out below.

Brownfield sites within existing towns and villages 1,500-2,500

Growth on the edges of existing main towns 23,000-28,000 New towns 11,000-13,000

Development at transport hubs 16.000–19.000

Expansion near key employment areas 5,000-6,000

Limited expansion of villages 13,000-15,000

Expanding urban areas on the edge of Buckinghamshire 6,000-7,000

Total 75,000-91,000

Windfall 7,400

Total housing supply + commitments 82,000–99,000

Housing requirement 91,000

with 5% buffer 95,550

What this means for us within Ivinghoe ward, with only villages and hamlets, is that the proposed increase would equate to 60 dwellings per parish. Obviously, for some smaller parishes an additional 60 dwellings would significantly increase their population. Therefore, my colleague ceiling on any increase to 10% maximum.

On top of this there is a proposal for the creation of new towns. These would be of at least 10,000 dwellings and would be additional to the numbers stated above.

Buckinghamshire Council are required to progress this new plan with a deadline of December 2026 to remain under the remit of the old system. Government have introduced a new way of calculating need and if we do not meet that deadline we will be working under the new scheme which will undoubtedly increase numbers which need to be provided.

Buckinghamshire Council have published their draft documents in 2 parts (parts A and B). These can be found on the web-site https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/planningand-building-control/planning-policy/local-planning. are very comprehensive documents.

Editor's Note. The following report came in too Accredited Status for two years by the National Archives, to be reviewed a year after the relocation to High Wycombe has taken place. The assessors congratulated the service on its strong community engagement offer and noted positive developments around digital preservation. The Archives Service has also been confirmed as an ongoing Place of Deposit, which means it can continue to hold specific records under Section 4 (1) of the Public Records Act cess and achieving this award confirms the Service is performing well in all aspects of delivery. The Archives Service has introduced a Virtual Classroom offer, in addition to the Virtual Searchroom and 'Ask the Archivist' online offers. This will enable schools across the county to incorporate archives into their learning.

Fair Funding settlement. Whilst this may sound a bit of a dry topic it is in fact vitally important. Buckinghamshire Council receives its revenue, approx. £1.2bn, from council tax and business rates. The days of general grants from government ended some years ago and since then we have been wary of what is called Negative Revenue Support Grant. This would mean that we would give some of the revenue we had raised in this county back to government for them to in turn give to another local authority elsewhere in the country. The latest proposal from government is that this will indeed happen and is due to be announced sometime toward the end of the year. The figure being suggested by the County Councils Network (CCN) is £40m which will bring pressure to our budget on an unprecedented scale. Central government are still to confirm the actual figures but on the CCN figures we would be in the highest 2 or 3 councils negatively affected. Since inception, Buckinghamshire Council has made savings of £120m in its first 4 year term and has budgeted for a further £120m of savings in this term. An additional demand of 33% on top of these savings will bring difficulty in deciding what to cut from our Peter Brazier and I will put forward a proposal to place a non-core services. We really hope our MPs will lobby hard on this subject as it is unfair to expect Bucks residents and businesses to subsidise other parts of the country.


