#### **INSTALLATION OF KISSING GATE**

The Parish Council is delighted to advise that a kissing gate has been reinstated at the public right of way, just off Station Road. This replaces the old rotten kissing gate that had disintegrated and was removed. The installation-was approved by Buckinghamshire Council and carried out by North Bucks rRIPPLE (ramblers Repairing & Improving Public Paths for Leisure and Exercise). It is hoped that this will mean an improvement in the surface of the public footpath especially during the winter months.

#### **SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES**

So, residents must have noticed the 3 new Speed Indicator Devices on Station Road, Opposite Orchard Manor and at the entry to the village, at the Recreation Ground.

#### To Clarify:

1. Unfortunately, the Parish Council currently cannot do anything about parking on Station Road and as Cllr Chris Poll, our Ivinghoe member, has advised 'that since it became a 30mph limit, parking there is legal.'

This issue has been discussed numerous times at the monthly PC meetings, plus the PC has discussed it with the Buckinghamshire Local Area Technician.

2. Speed Indicator Devices simply cannot be installed 'anywhere' as there are rules and regulations – they must be approved by Buckinghamshire Highways (which ours have been).

There are in fact 4 ground sockets installed which we can use, plus we can pop on the Parish Council streetlight poles if appropriate.

**Station Road at Scout Hut** – Primarily to encourage drivers to slow down on the approach to the Scout Hut where children are there daily and in the evenings.

It will be interesting to compare the results here with previous surveys because regardless of having a speedometer, drivers still speed along here, towards the roundabout, once they get past Church Path.

**Opposite Orchard Manor** – To hopefully slow traffic on the approach to the zebra crossing on exiting the village.

The next Residents' Association committee meeting will be on Wednesday 8th October at 7.15pm in the Methodist Church Hall. Please come along to tell us of any issues.

Our handyfolk will keep the hedge cut back to ensure the unit is visible.

The Old Allotments site, opposite the Recreation Ground – To slow traffic down as it enters the village.

Obviously, these units can and will be moved/turned around around but they have been placed at the above locations this time as a 'tester', primarily to compare past results. We appreciate that these units will not stop people speeding but they will make drivers aware of the speed limit and the speed that they are doing!

Remember, if residents want to know what is going on in the village you are very welcome to attend a Parish Council meeting to find out what the Parish Council is doing, or you can read the minutes which are readily available on the Cheddington Village website.

Also, please come along to a Parish Council monthly meeting if you have any suggestions to help further improve our lovely village.

#### **OUR MP'S NEWS.**

I'm delighted to write for the latest issue of Cheddington's Village Newsletter. This July marks one year since I was elected to serve as your Member of Parliament.

You may or may not have voted for me, but I aim to represent you all. I promised to be an accessible and active MP, and I've been out and about across the villages that are part of the constituency, meeting residents and supporting local organisations. Most recently, I spent the morning with the Cheddington Open Doors group with my team at Cheddington Methodist Church. The group provides an opportunity for residents to meet and socialise while enjoying a cuppa. The group raised various issues with me around the roads, pavements, parking and other local issues, and I am following up with Buckinghamshire Council. We also discussed wider issues like accessing healthcare, social care and anti-social behaviour.

It was also lovely to hear such kind words about my colleague Harry Murgatroyd, who stood as a Councillor for the lyinghoe ward in May.

The issues raised by Cheddington residents help inform my work in Parliament, where I've spoken more than 100 times in the last year to raise the issues that matter to you. For example, at the Cheddington "Meet and Greet" I held at the end of last year, members of the Cheddington Women's Institute met with me to raise their concerns regarding gambling. I have since met with the Minister for Gambling Baroness Fiona Twycross. I am pleased to see the Government is taking this issue seriously.

We covered the Government's work on the school curriculum, the research funding that will be made available by the Gambling Levy, ongoing work to reduce gambling related harm through reforming regulation, as well as the Government's introduction of online slot stake limits - £5 for over 25s and £2 for under 25s.

I will be keeping in touch with the Cheddington WI on this important issue and thank them for raising it with me.

Bus provision is another issue I have heard from residents and acted on. Earlier this year I launched my Aylesbury constituency bus survey. I wanted to understand your experiences of local bus services, so I could push as your MP for better, more accessible public transport for everyone in our community.

It's clear that people are tired of unreliable, overcrowded and infrequent bus services holding them back from opportunity. I am supporting the Government's Buses Bill, which would grant local authorities greater control over the routes, fares and service levels of bus services, with private operators bidding for contracts to operate franchises. The measures would also reverse the ban on publicly owned bus companies, giving local authorities more flexibility on how to approach fixing local services. Bucks Council has a real opportunity to utilise new powers contained within the Buses Bill to deliver for residents across Buckinghamshire. I have written to Bucks Council's Leader on this and I look forward to his response.

Alongside being out and about in the constituency and in Parliament, the bread-and-butter work of an MP is answering correspondence from residents and helping them solve issues they're having. Since being elected, I have set up my small and dedicated team from scratch. They help me to reply to the large volume of letters and emails that come my way.

We have processed over 7000 enquiries since the election, and I have corresponded with constituents on a wide range of subjects from animal welfare to potholes, HS2 to fly tipping. We have also held five village "Meet and Greet" events so far in Ivinghoe, Edlesborough, Cheddington, Wing and Bierton, and a "Meet Your MP" village hall event in Slapton, which provide an informal opportunity to meet with me and discuss issues both local and national.

These are just some of the things I've prioritised in year one. I am always open to feedback and ideas. Let me know what you'd like me to focus on in year two.

#### LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

#### Alleged rat sightings and excessive bird feed-

**ing.** I am writing to inform you that I have recently been contacted regarding rat sightings in the area. It has been reported that excessive bird feeding may be attracting rats, and that this behaviour is also attracting a higher number of the larger wild birds such as pigeons, doves and red kites. When large numbers of these types of bird are attracted to an area, residents may be adversely affected by large amounts of bird excrement or noise.

In order for rodents, such as rats and mice, to thrive they need both food and somewhere to live.

If you are currently feeding the wild birds, please do not put out excessive amounts of bird food or scatter the bird food on the ground. If necessary, clear the bird food off the ground if it is dropped. Please do not leave out food waste such as meat carcasses for the red kites as this behaviour encourages them to become urban scavengers which may lead to them becoming reliant on human handouts. Red kites have been successfully reintroduced to Buckinghamshire and these beautiful birds rarely have problems in finding dead animals etc to feed on.

Rodents are excellent climbers, and it is possible that they may be able to gain access to bird feeders even if they are hung in trees. If there is any evidence to suggest that rodents are active in your garden or in the vicinity of your property, please stop feeding the birds until the infestation has been brought under control.

If you keep animals in your garden (chickens, dogs etc.) please ensure good housekeeping, clear up after them and keep the area clear of dropped food. Please do not leave food out overnight. Store dry food (seed, pellets, animal biscuits etc.) in an appropriate sealed container and if possible, store them off the floor.

I would also recommend that you check for rodent activity in your garden, e.g., burrows, damage from gnawing and droppings. To help prevent harbourage excessive overgrowth should be cut back and obsolete items or rotting vegetation removed. If rodents have entered buildings, it is a good idea to cut back and remove any shrubs and plants which are growing up the walls of the building as rodents are very good at climbing up vegetation to gain access.

It is also recommended that all rubbish bags are placed into a green wheelie bin and put out for collection on your particular collection day so that any rats or mice in the area are not encouraged.

Please be aware that if there is evidence of rat activity on your land, you have a responsibility under the Prevention of Damage by Pests Act 1949 to ensure the problem is under control. If you are found to be encouraging rats and not taking the necessary steps to resolve the situation, then enforcement action will be taken.

The Council currently works with SDK Environmental Ltd (trading as Dial-A-Pest) and, if required, can provide free rat treatments for householders who are in receipt of certain means-tested benefits. If you think that this may apply to you, please contact SDK by telephoning them on 03444 828350 or by sending them an email via support@sdkenvironmental.com. You will be asked to provide proof of benefits as part of the booking process.

# **FARMING AND FOOD**

Our combine harvesting was completed on Wednesday (13<sup>th</sup> August) and straw baling and movement continues, also cultivation work, in very difficult conditions. As you gardeners will know the soil is solid. With metal parts in the equipment these parts break and get worn on a daily basis. Down time is expensive and so are the parts!

I think it's the case that farming and gardening is always challenging as we are unable to predict the conditions of our work due to the changes in our weather. I think the only other occupation comparable to farming is the fishing industry. I would not want to be on a trawler in all weathers.

We have had a wonderfully committed and cheerful team working on the farm this harvest. I talked about them in my last article and so some of you will have been aware of them and their visits to the local pubs in their very limited free moments! I know they enjoy meeting the locals and feeling a part of our community. After all farming produces essential food on which we all rely and it's good to welcome these workers to our village.

It is a great help to us that Tracy at Cheddington Airfield Café cooks and delivers meals to us for up to 17 people almost every day! She deserves a mention! Our guys enjoy dropping in there for breakfast now and again and they get a good welcome.

Also we have our workers lunches delivered by Sandwich Plus in Dolphin Square, Tring. This is a traditional bakery. Their sandwiches and cakes are so good. Freshly baked every day. If you haven't been there for a cheese tasting you have missed out! I can tell you they know their cheeses!



Just in the last two days I have read of an oat grower who was paid £200 a ton for his oats last summer. This summer he was paid £138. The inputs are higher. Just consider wages for example. A 1kg bag of porridge oats is around £2.65.

After all I'm told Stoke Mandeville is the village furthest away from the sea! So, according to weather articles in the farming press, we've been the unlucky ones this summer.

It's been a lovely time for all the children off school and for the summer holidays.



# FROM THE RECTOR God's Calling

Petertide is the weekend just before the summer holidays when most ordinations take place in the Church of England. I was ordained a deacon 12 years ago at Birmingham Cathedral in and then as a priest the following year at the same place. To be a priest shouldn't be seen as a higher or lower type of Christian. The ordination service describes that "priests are called to be servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. With their Bishop and fellow ministers, they are to proclaim the word of the Lord and to watch for the signs of God's new creation".

To take this step usually takes a few years of discernment and prayer with designated people in the church which culminates in a three day long residential interview. During

this I remember one particularly intense conversation where the vocations adviser asked, "Describe to me the vocation of..." (I was very ready for a question about the vocation of priesthood. I had been rehearsing the answer for weeks.) "Describe to me the vocation of baptism?" That wasn't the question I was expecting. But it is a centrally important question. Baptism, when a priest pours water over a candidate that could be an adult or could be a baby, is the starting point of the Christian journey and forever shapes our identity. And this is as full a vocation as any other vocation we may also have such as a profession or commitments you have made as a husband or wife. At the beginning of the baptism service I sometimes use these words...

"Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us that to enter the kingdom of heaven we must be born again of water and the Spirit, and has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth.

Here we are washed by the Holy Spirit and made clean. Here we are clothed with Christ, dying to sin that we may live his risen life.

As children of God, we have a new dignity and God calls us to fullness of life."

Four people from my churches came together recently to meet the Bishop of Buckingham, Bishop Dave, at St Edmunds in Maids Morton for a Confirmation Service to publicly confirm their baptism vows. All of them were adults. Some of them had been baptised recently, some decades ago. It was a truly joyful occasion. It was joyful for those publicly declaring their vocation. It was joyful for me as servant and shepherd seeing God's work in and through people's lives. Using words from the prophet Isaiah in the Old Testament these words were spoken, in God's name, over our four newest members...

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name: you are mine."

Dear Friends. Happy New Year!

This may seem a strange greeting but in schools, in the Methodist Church and in some other places as well we are transitioning from the old year into the new. Our church treasurers will be beginning the process of comparing their end of year again, various administrative delights will be coming across clergy desks and after the relative quiet of the summer months the pace of clergy life will begin to pick up.

Change is an interesting phenomenon. One way to exercise some clergy is to ask them to reflect on the merits and demerits of the different systems when it comes to clergy moving appointments. In methodism, unlike most other denominations, all our clergy move at the same time. We're ready to take up our new appointment at the beginning of September. In the meantime the matching process for clergy moving in 2026 has already begun to kick in. In other denominations the search for someone new cannot begin until the old one has disappeared which means that an interregnum has to occur whereas in our Methodist system at any given point each church has a named minister. Change is an interesting thing to manage. Within the school system there will be those taking their first tentative steps into formal education while others look to the joys of GCSE and A Level courses and begin to have to contemplate the question of what might come next. In September classes and new teachers will encounter each other and a whole new relationship begins. Change covers whether we like it or not.

This is seen in the reality of life: the lives of the people of Gaza have changed beyond recognition since the Israelis began their invasion. When love ones pass away everything becomes different. At times change can be brutal but we do seem to have an adaptability that enables us to cope. So this is not to forget the impact of experience but to indicate something of the resilience that people have. We just need to look at the example of the generation that went to war in which those are returned to civilian law and participated in the rebuilding of our country and laying the foundations of our modern society.

Some theories suggest that change is good for us, it encourages adaptability, allows new experiences and assists our development as human beings. This of course can be difficult when change is not what we want. Often though something new, a change can bring a new excitement to life. This week my one-year-old granddaughter had her first experience of eating a cherry, eating as many as her mother was prepared to put in front of her. The joy of the new experience, a change was joyfully evident.


